

Drentsche Aa


The Hondsrug region has withstood the ravages of time. The extensive stream system of the Drentsche Aa has preserved its original state and successfully resisted unsuitable redevelopment. Modernisation and a growing population have not been allowed to destroy the historic character of villages and old farmhouses.

The Drentsche Aa National Park, covering an area of 34,000 hectares, overlaps with the Hondsrug region in many places. The wonderful scenery attracts visitors from home and abroad.

Ridges and valleys formed by the ice

The Hondsrug region is unique. Nowhere else in Europe can you find an area where so many traces of the Ice Ages are so well preserved. The landscape of high and lower-lying ground was created during the Saalian Ice Age (150,000 years ago) by the pressure of ice and the force of meltwater. The sheet of ice which expanded southwards from Scandinavia also brought with it many stones and enormous boulders.


Treasures of our ancestors

The varied character of these ridges and valleys offered an attractive place for our prehistoric ancestors to settle. These early inhabitants hunted wild animals and fish or gathered edible plants for food. Farming first began here around 3000 BC on the higher-lying sandy hills. The 48 hunebeds or dolmens still to be found within the Geopark are burial monuments from that time. There are also well-preserved remains left by later inhabitants, such as burial mounds, field systems (celtic fields) and cart tracks on the route between Coevorden and Groningen.

A landscape made by man

The early Middle Ages saw the creation of farming villages known as 'es-dorpen'. These combined fertile soil on the higher-lying sandy ground (the 'es') with streams of clear-flowing water in the valleys. From the beginning of the 17th century – the days of turf extraction – people built the settlements known as 'peat colonies' to the east of the Hondsrug. For thousands of years the landscape of the Hondsrug region has been shaped by human activity and this will no doubt continue in the future.


The Arsenaal city museum in Coevorden tells the story of war and conflict along the Hondsrug and shows where traces can still be found today.


